Little Things

A few years ago a report appeared in the Nashville Banner concerning a power outage in the official residence of the Prime Minister of Japan. Security forces were put on emergency alert while electricians searched for the source of a short circuit that blacked out the residence and office, a 54-year-old structure.

The invader was found to be a four-inch mouse. Its charred body was found on top of a shorted electric wire in a basement power room, killed by 6,600 volts of electricity. Obviously the mouse bit off more than he could chew.

Over thirty years ago while living in North Alabama (only about six miles from Wilson Dam) we had an ice and snowstorm that caused hundreds of area residents to be without electricity for a week. The weight of the ice literally broke the power lines and poles for over a mile. A tornado or ice storms are what we usually think of when there is a power outage and that's usually true.

But little things, like a mouse, can be the cause of a power outage. Things we pay little attention to, such as an over-loaded circuit can plunge us into the dark.

This should remind us that as we see the destructive power of Satan in what is often regarded as the big sins, as adultery, murder, drunkenness, theft, etc., there is what man calls little things such as hatred, wrath, strife, covetousness, and envying that gnaw away and destroy our spiritual power – plunging us into darkness.
