THE POINTER

Planning Your Preaching is the title of a book by J. Winston Pearce. On Page 74, I read the following information:

The Hundred-year-old records of an Ohio church tell of a duly elected church officer designated as 'Pointer.' It was the responsibility of this person to stand in the pulpit by the side of the minister and 'point.' As the preacher would throw light upon some particular truth, 'Mr. Pointer' would point to some drowsing or indifferent member and cry:

'You, there, John Doe, that applies to you! Pay Attention!'

While it might be sometimes tempting to do so, I am not suggesting that this technique should be put into practice today. I have a feeling that this would not be the most popular "innovation" to be implemented.

At the same time, I hope that we all try to make a personal application of God's message to each of us. If all of us (including the speaker) feel as though God's message applies to "everybody else," it may not profit us as it should.

If, when we study the Bible, nobody "takes it personally" we've missed something really important. We've missed an opportunity to look into the mirror of God's word (cf. James 1:22-25) and make whatever corrections are necessary in order for us to be "...be conformed to the image of his Son..." (Rom. 8:20).

In the area about which we now speak, every preacher can think of similar instances.
