**A Gospel Meeting Is A Challenge to Error.**

- Error and false doctrine are the right-hand tools of the Devil (Ephesians 4:4).
- The gospel will be preached and error opposed. Let us not be afraid to stand for the truth.

**A Gospel Meeting Is A Challenge to Sinners.**

- A meeting turns the light of the gospel on the lives of sinners and challenges them to look at their lives (Acts 2:23, 37). It is a challenge to sinners to give up their sins and surrender unconditionally to Christ.
- It will get results too. It did on Pentecost and it will now (Acts 2:41).

**A Gospel Meeting Is A Challenge to Backsliders.**

- It is a challenge to the worldly, cold, and careless Christians to come back.
- Like any other congregation, we have our share of the careless. Let us work to get them to the meeting and give the gospel a chance to do its work.

**A Gospel Meeting Is A Challenge to Sing.**

- One of the greatest contributions to a meeting is good singing (Ephesians 5:19). Poor singing will kill any meeting.
- Another way to help make the singing poor is to sit at the back or scatter out all over the building. Come to the front of the building and then sing like you mean it.

**CONCLUSION:** The day of a gospel meeting is not dead. Churches may be dead but not the gospel (Hebrews 4:12) nor gospel meetings where the gospel is preached and Christians work to save the lost.
