THE POWER OF SINGING

There is great power in singing! People sing when they're happy, when they're sad, when they're hurt, and when they're determined: one's mood can be set by singing.

Think about the POWER OF SINGING:

1. **There is EXPRESSIVE POWER in singing.** Through our singing, we can express our awe and admiration for God ("Holy, Holy, Holy" or "How Great Thou Art"). We can express our individual commitment to the Lord ("All to Jesus I Surrender" or "I Am Thine, O Lord"). We can express our need for help, comfort, and guidance ("Does Jesus Care?" or "Farther Along"). We can express our assurance of an eternal hope in heaven, the home of the soul ("When We All Get to Heaven" or "Won't It Be Wonderful There").
2. **There is TEACHING POWER in singing.** We teach by many means: by the spoken word and the written word, and even by our actions. And the Bible says that we also teach by singing: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord" (Colossians 3:16). We can teach great lessons about Christ's life ("Tell Me the Story of Jesus") and His great sacrifice ("When I Survey the Wondrous Cross"). We can teach great lessons about the beauty of the church ("The Church's One Foundation") and the warmth of Christian fellowship ("Blest Be the Tie That Binds"). We can teach about Christian living ("Live For Jesus").
3. **There is UNIFYING POWER in singing.** Our singing unites us together and binds us as brethren in the Lord's church, for in our singing we are mutually engaged. In our singing, the following is involved: "Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs..." (Ephesians 5:19) and "...teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs" (Colossians 3:16). Not the phrases: "yourselves...one another." As Christians, we are all to sing in worshipping God: we speak to one another, teach one another, and thereby unify and build up Christ's body!

Think how much poorer the church would be, and our individual Christian lives also, if there was no singing. God in His wisdom gave us a means of worshipping Him, of strengthening ourselves, and of encouraging one another when He placed singing in His worship!
