THE DEAD SEA SCROLLS

In early 1947, while searching in a cave near the Dead Sea for a lost animal, a herdsman discovered some large jars. When opened, it was found they contained leather scrolls wrapped in linen cloth. Eventually, as these scrolls came into the hands of scholars, some were recognized as very ancient copies of Scripture. Upon learning of this find, W.F. Albright proclaimed it as “the greatest manuscript discovery of modern times.”

Approximately 500 manuscripts (of which 175 are biblical) have been found in ten major caves. Of all the Old Testament books, only a copy of Esther is lacking. The writing style shows that they were probably produced between 250 BC and AD 68. Other evidence also suggest that the scrolls were written in the two centuries preceding the Roman capture of the nearby Qumran settlement in AD 68.

What makes this discovery so great is that until 1947, the oldest complete copy of the Hebrew Bible dated to only the tenth century AD. As the English Scriptures are based on these relatively recent manuscripts, some critics charged that the books of the Bible were not written in ancient times. However, in one giant leap, the discovery at Qumran extended the age of the earliest known texts by over one thousand year.

More important, it was found that the contents had remained virtually unchanged during those millennia. For example, in Isaiah 53 only 17 characters are different. Of these, 10 are variations in spelling, 4 are minor stylistic changes, and 3 make up one added word (“light”). The sum effect on the meaning of Isaiah’s inspired chapter? – Absolutely none. Here is a wonderful case of God’s providence in preserving His Word for mankind through the ages (1 Peter 1:25).
