POP QUIZ

One of my favorite “tricks” when I taught school was to “spring a pop quiz” on my students

Guess what? I’m reverting back to my old ways.

I thought I’d give all of us a ten question “pop quiz” in this article. It may help us to see how effective our Bible classes and our own personal study time have been lately.

I’ve tried to select some questions that should be fairly easy and basic. If you’ve been a Christian for any time at all, you’ve heard and/or read the answers to each of these questions repeatedly. Let’s see how we do –

1. Who said, “...I will build my church?”
2. Where would you find that statement in the Bible?
3. Where would you find the statement “The Churches of Christ salute (or greet) you?”
4. What four men wrote the gospel accounts of the life and ministry of Jesus Christ?
5. What does the word “gospel” mean?
6. Which of those four men were also apostles?
7. What reason(s) would you give somebody to explain why we do not use instruments of music in our worship?
8. What scriptures would you use to support your reason(s)?
9. Where would you find the following statement? “Then Peter said unto them, Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.”
10. There are two verses that tell us that we are “...baptized into Jesus Christ...” or “...baptized into Christ...” Could you tell somebody who asked you where one of them is? (extra credit for *both!!*)

- One must **BE FAITHFUL UNTO DEATH** (Revelation 2:10)
