7 Miles to Church

Frances Kell was raised to go to church. Her father was an elder and a strict disciplinarian. When I asked her if her husband, Carl was a Christian before they got married, her response was, "Oh, yes. He was baptized about a month before we married. I couldn't have married him if he wasn't a Christian."

Right after the Kells married, they moved to Hickory Valley, Tennessee (about 10 miles out of Sparta) and started attending the Hickory Valley church of Christ. The church was located about 7 miles from where they lived. And they...walked.

"You walked 7 miles to go to church?"

"Yes."

"7 miles round trip, right?"

"No. 7 miles one way."

"Wait a minute. Are you saying you walked 14 miles to church."

"Yes. Rain. Shine. Sleet. Or, snow."

"That's incredible."

"And we never missed...Unless we were sick."

When I caught my composure and pulled my jaw up off the floor, she then added these words:

"And I was pregnant."

Compare that with today's convenient Christianity. We go to church if it's convenient. If it fits into our busy schedules. If we're not on vacation. If we don't have to work. If the kids are not playing ball. If I don't go to grandmas. If company isn't coming. If I'm feeling ok. If it doesn't interfere with my fun. If...

One day Jesus is going to interrupt our schedules. As a thief in the night. The trumpet shall sound, the angels will appear and the dead shall be raised. Won't it be great if he finds you in church? "We should not quit meeting together and encourage each other. You should do this more and more as you see the day coming" (Hebrews 10:25).

HOW TO STAY SAFE IN THE WORLD TODAY

- Avoid riding in automobiles because they are responsible for 20% of all fatal accidents.
- Do not stay at home because 17% of all accidents occur in the home.
- Avoid walking on the streets or sidewalks because 14% of all accidents occur to pedestrians.
- Avoid traveling by air, rail, or water because 16% of all accidents involve these forms of transportation.
- Of the remaining 33%, 32% of all deaths occur in hospitals. Above all else, avoid hospitals.

You will be pleased to learn that only .001% of all deaths occur in worship services of the church, and these are usually related to previous physical disorders. Therefore, logic tells us that the safest place for you to be at any given point in time is at church!
