### What Might Have Been

It was the last hole of the Los Angeles Open golf tournament, and Ben Crenshaw had just rolled in a long putt of some twelve to fifteen feet. His wife was ecstatic, and he likely felt the same way but because of experience on the tour realized that any premature rejoicing would be unwise. His opponent stood over an equally long putt, stroked the ball, and saw it hit the middle of the cup. On the first hole of *sudden death* Ben missed a short putt and watched his opponent receive the winner's check for his first place finish. Ben had missed by less than an inch – but he missed.

Life is filled with *what might have been*. Ball games are lost because of a missed free throw, a failure to kick a ball between the uprights, a step out of bounds. Lives are lost because someone missed a stop sign by a fraction of a second, or went beyond the speed limit and couldn't handle his car on a curve. All of these things are matters of judgment and seldom of choice. Without question, the most tragic of all *what might have been* scenarios is that which will be experienced by so many on the day of judgment. It is difficult to imagine the number of people in eternity who will hear our Lord say, "Depart from me, ye workers of iniquity, for I never knew you." And why? Not because of a matter of fatal *judgment*, but because of a matter of fatal *choice*.

People will be lost in eternity because they will have chosen to be lost. What a tremendous question God one time asked Israel when He said, "Why will ye die?" (Ezekiel 18:31). Why will men voluntarily choose spiritual death, when God has made it possible for them to live eternally? It is one of life's greatest and most perplexing problems. God has provided man with the promise of life, the means to achieve that promise, and the assurance that he will be guided throughout this life by the unerring counsel of God's Word. Man will have an eternity to ponder *what might have been*.
